Oberstdorf Shorttrack Summercamp



3 - 10 August 2024





From 3 - 10 August 2024 the 13th edition of the Oberstdorf Shorttrack Summercamp is held in Oberstdorf-Germany. Over 100 hours Ice time, Welcome Barbeque, Mountain Run, Biathlon, Recreational Events, Clinics for beginning officials and parents, a shorttrack competition and award ceremony will make it a wonderful shorttrack week for all attendents. For the Oberstdorf Shorttrack Summercamp skaters from all over the world are invited. The Summercamp is organized by the volunteers of Shorttrackonline.info, the Amsterdam Skating Club Jaap Eden and the Eissport Club Oberstdorf supported by the Sports Office of Oberstdorf.



Participation

Participation in the summercamp and shorttrack competition is open to all age categories. All skaters must be a member of a club affiliated to their National Skating Association (member of the ISU) in their own country and have a licence/insurance for the coming season.

Recreational Participants

Family and accompanying friends can also take part in the Off-Ice events in a recreational classification at own risk and responsibility.

Support of parents and family

Parents and family are requested to support with help during all activities and events which will take place during the week.

Shorttrack Competition

Organizer: The summercamp is organized by volunteers of Shorttrackonline.info, the Amsterdam Skating Club Jaap Eden and the Eissport Club Oberstdorf with support of the Sports Office of the City of Oberstdorf.

ST competition:: The Shorttrack competition is an integral part of the Oberstdorf Shorttrack Summercamp and is held over 2 days.

Venue: The shorttrack competition will take place at the ice rink of the Eissport Zentrum Oberstdorf which is 60x30 meter and has a safety padding of international standard.

Regulations: The shorttrack competition will be held in accordance with the 2024 ISU Regulations and relevant ISU Communications.

Classification: For all distances a Distance Classification will be made following Rule 297, paragraph 1 and 2. Final Points 34, 21, 13, 8, 5 ,3 ,2 and 1 will be awarded in the Finals A and B only, in descending order following the Distance Classification.

In the case of a tie, all Skaters involved in a tie will receive the points awarded for that finish position. If two Skaters are involved in a tie, the points for the following finish place will not be awarded, in the case of three Skaters involved, the following two finish places will not be awarded.

Skaters who could not start in the first round of any distance due to a valid reason will be assigned the last position on the respective distance classification.

The competition is concluded with an Overall Classification. For this Final Classification, and any Intermediate Overall Classification, the Skaters are ranked:

- by total number of Final Points;
- by combined ranking over all Distance Classifications;
- by the highest ranking achieved in one of the distances and subsequent other best rankings;
- by best time over the longest distance on the program.

Skaters or Relay Teams who on any distance, received a Red Card will not be ranked, but listed as participants at the bottom of the Overall Classification

Awards: Prizes will not be awarded for the Shorttrack competition but will be awarded for the Overall classification of the **Mountain Run, Biathlon and Shorttrack competition TOGETHER** for the first five skaters in each category.

Liability: In accordance with the ISU rules, the organizers accept no liability for injury or damage sustained by competitors, recreational participants, public and/or officials during all training sessions and events of the summercamp. The summercamp, competition programme and announcement are tentative and if necessary subject to change.

Clinic for officials

During the Summercamp clinics will be held for beginning Starters, Referees, Competitors Stewards and Manual Timekeepers free of charge. People who are interested can enter for this on the special Questionnaire form.

Entry procedure and extra tickets

- Tickets:** All entered skaters get free tickets for the Welcome Dinner, Mountain Run Lunch, Sportive Recreational Event and for a nice memento.
- Extra tickets:** Family and accompanying friends of the skaters can join in the recreational events (not the shorttrack competition) and can buy extra meal-tickets at a special discount price.
- Clinics:** Clinics will be held during the week for beginning officials for general / starter / administration and referee. Names of people interested in doing this can be registered on the Questionnaire form.
- Entry:** Entry must be done by the club-representative or by National Federations with the club-password on the Entry page of www.shorttrackonline.info before 7 July 2024.
- Questionnaire:** All skaters have to fill in a special Questionnaire form as a final Entry and reservation for all activities and meal-tickets. This form can be downloaded from the website www.Skatingonline.info on the page **INFO - ENTRY PROCEDURE**. A special password to enter this page will be given to all skaters via a separate message to the club-secretary. We request all skaters to fill in this form as quick as possible.
- Entry fee:** The entry-fee for the Summercamp, including the shorttrack competition, is 295,00 euro per person. Entry after 15th of July entry fee is 10,00 euro higher. The Entry fee for the summercamp, including the shorttrack competition and extra mealtickets, can this year for the first time be done by bank-account. Information about the procedure can be found in the Questionnaire form which is published on the website Skatingonline.info.

Please pay attention to the following

- it is the intention that all skaters who enter for the summercamp will participate in **all events**
- skaters will be placed into training groups based on level and age (give special requests at entry-form)
- it is not allowed to change training session or group without permission of the Organising Committee.
- all skating participants must have basic competition experience on ice
- during the training sessions the equipment of all skaters must be according to the ISU rules
- for inline activities helmet, gloves and kneepads are obligatory
- before the 1st session the safety padding must be put on the ice by all skaters supported by parents
- after the last training session the safety padding must be taken off the ice by all skaters supported by parents (see the schedule which will be published for this)
- in case no track-stewards are available during the shorttrack competition all skaters will stay on the ice for one more race to serve as track-steward.
- at the Recreational events Juniors-DEF must be guided for by the club/team officials or parents.



Oberstdorf is the most southern city of Germany located in the Algäu Region of the Bavarian Alps. The city located at the foot of the Nebelhorn and Fellhorn mountain has 9000 inhabitants and is at an altitude of 813 metres. Public transport in the village is free.

Oberstdorf is famous for its beautiful surroundings, cheap holiday apartments, mountain bike and cycling tracks, a perfect inline-track and Olympic Sport Centre with three top-quality ice rinks. As Oberstdorf is also an Olympic training centre everybody and everything is focussed on serving athletes.

Most famous is the Ski Jumping Stadium with its annual competition at New Year, an international Figure Skating competition for the Nebelhorn Trophy and the Figure skating show which is held every year at Christmas and is televised around the world.
